
JOB DEMANDS



PLANNING FOR A QCE

The Senior Education and Training Plan (SET Plan) helps each student plan and structure their senior learning around their abilities, interests and ambitions. The SET Plan is a map of what, where and how a student will study during their senior phase of learning — usually Years 10, 11 and 12.

What is a Set Plan?

Planning should be finalised by the end of Year 10 and is agreed between the student, their parents or carers and the school. The SET Plan should be regularly reviewed by schools, students and parents or carers, and updated as required.

IMPORTANT TERMINOLOGY:

General Subjects – are directed at students interested in pathways beyond school in tertiary studies (university), VET and work pathways.

Applied subjects - these subjects are directed at students interested in pathways beyond high school – choices in these subjects lead you to VET training or work.

VET – Vocational and Educational Training are certificate courses or diploma courses that provide practical, work ready skills for and competency based.

QCE – Queensland Certificate of Education is typically awarded, when 20 QCE credits are obtained (4 semesters of 5 subjects passed) upon graduation from year 12.


IMPORTANT TERMINOLOGY

ATAR - Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank, is the standard measure of a students overall academic achievement in comparison to other students. It is a percentage rank, not a mark, and indicates a students position relative to others in a given year.

University prerequisites -a subject or other requirement (such as interview, portfolio or audition) that a student must have successfully studied, prior to enrolling in a specific course or program.

QTAC - Queensland Tertiary Admissions Centre (QTAC) operates the tertiary application service for QLD universities. QTAC is responsible and determines ATAR calculations



Advanced standing

If you have prior studies or work experience, you may be eligible for advanced standing (credit). You can apply for advanced standing once you've been accepted to QUT. If you're in your first semester of study, you must apply for advanced standing within 10 days of receiving your offer.
